

**STAINBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL**  
**Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2016**  
**At Hood Green Pavilion commencing 7.00 p.m.**

**1261. Apologies for Absence:** There were no apologies for absence.

**1262. To receive disclosures from Councillors on matters to be considered at the meeting:** No disclosures of personal and prejudicial interests were declared

**1263. To approve the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2016:** The minutes of the meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2016, having been previously circulated, were approved as a true record.

**1264. Matters arising:**

**a. Barnsley Bus Partnership Consultation:** Since the previous meeting we have received further details of the proposals made under the Barnsley Bus Partnership Consultation which have serious implications for the Parish. If the proposals are implemented there will be no buses through the Parish from January 2017. Posters have been put on both notice boards alerting parishioners and suggesting that they should take part in the consultation if they want to have buses in the future.

The Parish Council discussed the need for public transport and what steps could be taken to ensure that our views were taken into account by BBP and SYPTE. Brian Moss agreed to obtain sufficient consultation forms and arrange a letter drop to each dwelling. In addition the PC would send a more detailed letter highlighting the specific needs of the Parish. Ian Glasby, Sam Lockwood-Dukes and Brian Moss will attend a meeting that has been arranged with other Parishes and SYPTE.

**b. Pavilion – General Improvements:** There has been no further progress on Pavilion improvements.

**c. Safety at Stainborough Crossroads:** We have two alternative suppliers for the suggested speed indicator Devices and need to consider the advantages of each. Because of the high cost of this equipment installation will need to be budgeted for the next financial year.

Robert Barnard advised that they are considering a similar idea at Tankersley. Brian Moss will contact the Tankersley Clerk, Kenny Blanton.

**d. Dog Fouling:** Sam Lockwood-Dukes delivered the new signs to the meeting. Brian Moss to arrange for fitting.

**e. Village Planters:** Brian Moss has chased up Elaine Downs who controls the Councils Green and Clean Team and she will ensure that the remaining brambles are cleared away and weed killer is applied to kill off the remaining vegetation.
