

**STAINBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL**  
**Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2019**  
**At Hood Green Pavilion commencing 7.00 p.m.**

**1481. Apologies for Absence:** There were no Apologies for Absence.

**1482. To receive disclosures from Councillors on matters to be considered at the meeting:** No disclosures of personal and prejudicial interests were declared

**1483. To approve the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2019:** The minutes of the meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2019, having been previously circulated, were approved as a true record.

**1484. Matters arising:**

**a. Pavilion – General Improvements:**

A quotation for refurbishment of the Notice Boards has been obtained from Twiggs which at £3000 was considered excessive. We have contacted Men in Sheds who have indicated a materials cost of circa £200.00 plus a donation towards their running costs. The Parish Council agreed to proceed with the Men in Sheds quotation.

Kelvin has arranged the purchase of timber for repair of the two damaged benches in Hood Green. The timber for one of the benches will be supplied free of charge by Howarth Timber while the timber for the second bench will be sponsored by Mr. Jack West, one of our Parishioners.

**b. Safety at Stainborough Crossroads:** Luke Robinson advised that work to Round Green chevrons should be completed by end of February. This work has still not been completed. Brian to chase Roads.

There have been parking problems at Stainborough Crossroads caused by high traffic volumes at the newly opened Wentworth Castle Gardens and changes to the on-site parking. Brian to write to Sylvia Ward at National Trust

**c. Defibrillators:** The Tesco Customer Vote ended at the end of June. We are awaiting the results which Tesco say may take up to six weeks to confirm.

Kelvin and Sam have been presented with a pre-owned Defibrillator by Ms Wickinson of the Barnsley Coronary Care Club with Photographs of the handover in the Barnsley Cronicle. This is a major contribution towards our Defibrillator fund.

Susan Moss has organized an Afternoon Tea Event on 21<sup>st</sup> July to raise funds for the Defibrillators.

**d. Volunteers:** The first three volunteer events were held on 4<sup>th</sup> June 1<sup>st</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> July and all were well attended. Dates for future events are yet to be set.

Paul Denton has suggested additional planting in the West Corners which would also make it easier to mow these areas. Kelvin to discuss with Adam from Twiggs.
